

### Your Future, Our Focus

EAP Extend is driven by three core aims:

- To increase engagement and attendance by offering practical, interest-led learning experiences - These sessions aim to reengage students who are at risk of exclusion or persistent absence by providing handson, enjoyable activities that foster a sense of success and belonging.
- To develop social, emotional, and communication skills in a supportive and structured environment - Through collaborative activities such as cooking, sport, and music, students build confidence, improve emotional regulation, and strengthen their ability to work with others.
- To provide early intervention that supports retention in mainstream education and reduces the likelihood of exclusion - By addressing barriers to learning through creative and therapeutic provision, the sessions serve as a preventative measure, supporting students to remain in or reintegrate successfully into their mainstream setting.





Our intent is to build positive and trusting relationships with all stakeholders and to re-engage children successfully with their learning. Our values of **Respect**, **Resilience** and **Responsibility** are embedded in all aspects of the work we do providing our students with the tools they need to face the challenges of school life and life in the adult world. We place the individual at the heart of what we offer and EAP prides itself on the bespoke and targeted programmes for students.

### OFSTED REPORT

"The school ensures pupils learn a broad and ambitious curriculum that is highly tailored to their interests and needs. In addition to what pupils learn on site, the school works with a range of other settings, so pupils can study a broader range of subjects that interest them, including motor mechanics, construction, horticulture and hair and beauty. The school ensure these providers are of high quality so that pupils get the maximum benefit from working with them. The targeted use of alternative provision helps pupils to feel motivated in coming to school and has had a positive impact on pupils' overall attendance. "





"The provision for pupils' personal development is of very high quality and links carefully with the broader curriculum offered to pupils. For example, pupils are taught how to keep themselves safe in school, the community and when online. They learn how to keep physically and emotionally healthy. Pupils build understanding of managing their finances and the importance of respectful and consensual relationships. Pupils enjoy many opportunities to celebrate diversity and develop their individual talents and interests, such as music and drama."

### How do we ensure our provision is safe?

EAP only works with providers who meet our high standards around safeguarding, health & safety and quality of education.

Each year, providers must submit their updated policies and procedures for safeguarding and health & safety, as well as a copy of their public liability insurance where relevant. Once this is submitted, we then formalise our partnership through a Service Level Agreement (SLA). This is updated annually and outlines the responsibilities of all parties.

EAP Safeguarding and Child Protection policy applies to all staff and volunteers working within EAP and ensures we provide an overall environment that is safe for children and conducive to their learning, development and wellbeing by:

- Following safe recruitment procedures
- Providing ongoing training of staff in the area of Child Protection
- Outlining clear procedures for managing a Child Protection issue
- Supporting vulnerable and at risk children in conjunction with other agencies
- Seeking to put in place protective factors for any child at risk
- Protection from radicalization and extremist narratives

Safeguarding and child protection is at the forefront of what EAP does to support pupils and underpins all aspects of process and policy development.

### How do we report on attendance?

Eap Extend and its alternative provision suppliers will make phone call to the parent/carer in the first instance if a student is not present at the start of the session. The attendance will be logged on DCPro the MIS system that EAP Extend are using. Each school has access to DCpro to monitor the attendance of their students

### How do we know what goes on at our provisions?

At EAP and YAC, all provisions are rigorously monitored and tracked to ensure both quality of education and student progress.

Each half term our providers will complete a report on every student. Providers will comment on students' engagement, behaviour and provide us with an overview of how much of the course they have completed.

### QUALITY ASSURANCE

### How do we quality assure and monitor our providers?

On each visit that is carried out by a member of EAP staff, the provision is assessed in the following areas;

- Is the provision compliant with safeguarding?
- Is the provision compliant within the framework provided by Ealing LA?
- Is the provision compliant with health & safety, policies and practice?
- Is the provider providing a supportive learning environment?
- Are they providing a high quality of education?
- Are the students engaged and making progress?

A digital record is kept of all visits carried out. On this record we note which members of staff are working at the provision, the students present/absent and a summary of what work is being completed.

Records of these visits are kept centrally, and school leads can request samples/ copies of visits

carried out as part of their quality assurance process. We welcome school staff to carry out regular visits alongside our staff to gain further understanding of our courses and to build relationships with provision staff.

### STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

### What we expect from all students

At our provisions we expect students to observe the expectations of the provider and of EAP. This is to ensure the safety, enjoyment and progress of all students. Each provider will have specific expectations for their setting, however as a minimum we expect students to observe the following:

- To be appropriately dressed for the provision
- To arrive on time to ensure a prompt start to every session
- To communicate with staff and other students with respect
- To follow the direction of staff members
- To respect the environment and equipment at the provision
- To remain safe by observing all health & safety requirements
- Please also note that smoking or vaping at any of our provisions is not permitted

### For students accessing provision at EAP you will also be asked to observe the following;

- To wear the uniform of your mainstream school (including school shoes) unless provided with further direction to suit the needs of the course.
- To ensure all personal belongings will be placed in a secure location for the duration of your lesson, including mobile phones, AirPods etc.
- As per EAP policy, all students will be wanded on arrival.

### Travel to and from your provision

Students who ride a bike are welcome to do so. We encourage you to bring a bike lock to keep them secure. <u>E-scooters are not permitted and providers at EAP will not allow these to be stored or kept on site at any of our courses.</u>

### Who can refer a student to EAP Extend?

Referrals can only be made by a mainstream school. Schools commission provision from us with a student remaining on roll at their mainstream school. The responsibility for the student's progress, welfare and safeguarding remains with the mainstream school with the support of EAP. Students will be on EAP guest roll and will remain single roll with their home school. Schools will be notified of attendance daily.

### Do you accept referrals from schools out of area?

We predominantly support schools and students who live within the borough of Ealing. We can support students who live outside our area, however this is dependent on the availability of the provision required.

**Students who have EHCP's**: We request that a copy of the latest EHCP is sent with the referral. We are unable to confirm a place until we have this as this must be shared with providers in advance. Students who require additional support may need a TA from their mainstream school to accompany them to the first couple of sessions to help settle them in.



Our Key Stage 3 Alternative Curriculum, for students in Years 7, 8 and 9, is designed to ensure students receive additional support alongside their mainstream school curriculum. This has proved to be extremely successful with many students benefiting from our short courses.


Our Key Stage 3 curriculum is designed to support, motivate, challenge and re-engage students who may have found education challenging in the early years of their secondary school experience.

In line with our school values, we give students opportunities to develop their courage to try new things, meet new people and to engage in positive learning experiences.

Alongside this we teach them how to be resilient both in learning and in all aspects of their life so they are able to feel proud when they achieve their goals.

Our courses are divided into three termly blocks, with a mixture of full days and half days provisions.

We strongly advise submitting referrals well in advance of the commencement of a new course. We can only confirm a student's place once we receive the online referral form and a fully completed parent consent form.

### **Programme Overview**

At LMP Alternative Provision, we're proud to offer a powerful early intervention programme designed to support young people at a crucial crossroads. Our Restorative & Personal Development Programme is a focused 12-week journey for students in Years 7 to 9 who are showing signs of disengagement, behavioural challenges, or are at risk of exclusion.

This structured, trauma-informed programme blends restorative practices with real-life personal development skills, helping young people to reset and re-engage with education and life. What the Programme Offers:

- Emotional Regulation
- Practical tools to help students understand and manage their emotions, reduce impulsive behaviour, and improve overall wellbeing.
- Conflict Resolution
- Strategies to de-escalate tensions and resolve disagreements calmly and constructively.
- Self-Reflection & Awareness
- Encourages students to think about their choices, understand consequences, and identify personal values.
- Resilience & Growth Mindset
- Activities that build perseverance, self-belief, and the ability to bounce back from setbacks.
- Positive Relationships
- Fosters empathy, respectful communication, and healthy peer connections.

Led by experienced and compassionate practitioners, this programme creates a safe space where students can take a step back, gain perspective, and move forward with greater confidence and purpose. It's more than just an intervention; it's a fresh start.
